We can visit the Museum.

There are rules in the Museum:

- ✓ I look at the exhibits inside and outside the showcases from a distance without touching. This way everything remains clean and, above all, safe.
- ✓ During the visit I stay close to those who accompany me.
- ✓ I walk slowly and mind my movements.
- ✓ I speak in a low voice. I can also use my inner voice.

I remember the rules so everyone is happy!



At the entrance I will get my ticket. If there are people waiting, I might need to stay a few minutes in a queue.



Next to the tickets there are toilets and water coolers.



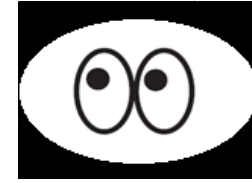
If I get tired I can sit on benches.
These are located inside the Museum.



If I need a wheelchair and I don't have one,
I can ask for one at the Museum.



After the ticket office I reach the lobby.
This is where the exhibits of the month are located.



How I look:

- I stand in front of the exhibits, but not too close.
- I use my eyes and not my hands.
- I keep my hands close to my body.

The exhibits are in showcases (display windows) in the center or on the walls. I can make up stories about the exhibits in my mind.

This is a lot of fun!



To the left of the entrance there is the Private Life Hall.
I can see objects from the Mycenaean, Prehistoric and Roman period.
I can walk among mosaic floors of ancient houses.



Right across of the Private Life Hall there is the entrance to the Public Life room.



At the end of the hall there are the statues of gods and mosaic floors.
It's interesting to learn about them.



I will pass through the lobby once more,
to continue my visit to the Cemetery Hall.



I can see various exhibits related to burial customs.



It's time to leave the Cemetery Hall.
Across the exit I see the Periodical Exhibitions Hall.



I can go upstairs. I can use the stairs.
I can also use the elevator.



Upstairs, I can walk on the bridge.
I can see the halls of Private and Public Life from above.



Next to the tickets desk is the Museum shop.
If I want, I can buy gifts for my friends and my family on the way out.
